
- Closing Days: Every Monday (except public holidays), January 1st, Lunar New Year's Day, and Chuseok (Korean Thanksgiving) Day.

Climber Zone is an experiential exhibition where visitors engage in physical activities such as rock climbing, gymnastics, sliding, and tree tower climbing while exploring the body of the herbivorous dinosaur Brachiosaurus. - Bus Get off at Soyo-san Station bus stop and walk for 5 minutes.
- Subway Take Exit 1 of Soyo-san Station (Line 1) and walk for 8 minutes.
- Car Take National Route 3 towards Dongducheon and turn right at Soyo-san Junction. The museum is 300 meters ahead.
